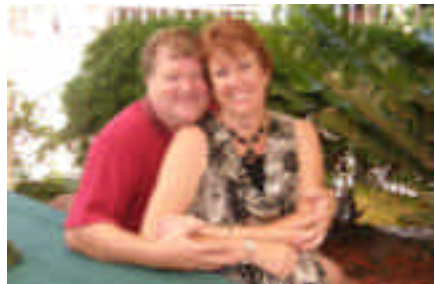
The Adelaide Paddle steamer restoration on the Murray river. —*Not exactly sure of the level of Apex commitment in this project.*

It is with great sadness that we record the passing of Melbourne-Gippsland member Alan Padgham on Saturday 27th November. Apex 40 members will remember Alan as the production part of the team responsible for Roaring 40's for some 15 years up to 2006 and for setting up and running the Apex 40 website for many years.

Alan was one of the group of eight recently retired Apexians in Melbourne who, in 1972, got together to consider establishing a social organisation for fellow past Apexians, resulting in the birth of Apex 40 the next year. Since then Alan has been an active member of Melbourne-Gippsland branch and has attended many Rorts where, in his own quiet way, he was always keen to meet up with other Apex 40 members and further our aim of 'continuing fellowship'. The last Rort that Alan attended with Jan was at Wyong last year.

Sadly, Alan has since been in ever worsening health following a series of strokes that left him largely incapacitated and he has spent most of this last year in a nursing home.

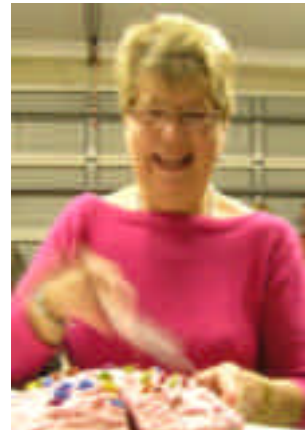

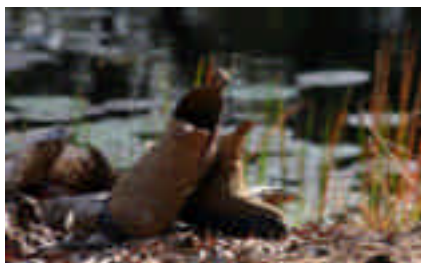
